The day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday is often an empty day. This will be an opportunity for quiet reflection on the events of Holy Week as we look forward to celebrating the resurrection.

Glenholm Kirk united with Broughton in 1794 and there is very little left of the Kirk itself in Glenholm graveyard. It was probably founded as a place of worship by St. Cuthbert in the 7th century, although the first record of the Church of St. Cuthbert of Glenholm is in 1272 when the Clerk to the Diocese of Glasgow, gave the rights to the church in Glenholm to the Augustinian canons of Scone!

It's a lovely place to pray as we think of the time of waiting when the women of Galilee waited for the end of the sabbath so that they could go and anoint Jesus' body – unaware of what was to come.



Looking for other ways to mark our 80th year? Your church could join our **Trees of Hope project** and plant a tree as a sign of commitment.






