So much that changes in life is beyond our control and certainly more often initiated elsewhere and yet impacts upon our lives. However, we also know that we can participate in change and help shape and direct how that impacts on our own lives and community. The reality is, as we know, things change whether we initiate it, join in, or sit on the side-lines.

Change has always taken place in church life as we have ideas, set up new projects, let go of old formats, engage with the relationship of faith in our world and so do shape it as it moves along. Change also takes place in the wider arena which impacts on the local, or indeed, the local has created the national which returns to change us again.

In the near future there will be far fewer ministers in the church (around 40% reach retirement age in the next five years while far fewer enter), there are fewer members which is evident to us all, many of those are older, and so there are fewer able people to do all the things we did before, and also not quite so much money coming in, and we have too many inappropriate buildings. Around the country, from the church offices, to presbyteries to local congregations people are seeking to discern how we can change in order to acknowledge that situation and create something new.

Here in our area of Melrose and Peebles Presbytery all the local churches have been asked to have conversations with neighbours, share ideas, hopes, concerns, and imagination in order that we participate in the shaping of a changing church. We do not know what shape that future church will take, but with faith we will discover it as we journey together. The reality is that things will change and we can help shape that or be shaped by it. It may also mean that we will all have to let go of or lay down something of our current life and that may be something we have treasured. But to lay down something costly lies at the heart of our Christian story as does the image of something having to die in order that something new rises.

So, we are challenged to acknowledge change, identify what is changing, move from seeking to resuscitate that which is gone, and participate in reforming our future ever and always trusting in that story of resurrection.






gardening. It is great fun and all our classes attend.


