'Everyone is the friend of one who gives gifts. PROVERBS 19:6

Is there any point in arguing with someone who disagrees with you especially when it comes to matters of faith? Presumably, you would like them to change their mind. But that is easier said than done. Experience shows that trying to get people to change their minds especially if it involves changing beliefs that are linked to their sense of identity, is extremely difficult. As one writer put it, any kind of conflict involving a person's personal attachment to their belief system be it religious or political invariably encourages "competitive personal contests rather than collaborative searches for the truth."

When we engage in the kind of 'mine is better than yours' approach to dialogue it often makes things worse. Disagreements can begin to feel like a war in which the opposites sides dig the trenches of their religious and political convictions even deeper. The result is that each side then begins to use any issue as an opportunity to launch their beliefs, positions, and convictions back and forth like verbal hand grenades. All the while failing to realise that people are never likely to change their mind when feel like they are being subject to an attack.

These kinds of conflicts might give everyone involved the temporary satisfaction of —'that just proves that I am right, and they are wrong.' But the odds are that neither camp is winning the argument; on the contrary, attacks make often make opponents dig deeper trenches.

Jesus brought the Gospel to us as a gift not as a demand. If we want to change hearts and minds, we could start by refusing to use your values, and the convictions that go with them, as weapons and start offering them as *a gift*.

Garden Ramblings

My favourite month April is nearing its end, drier than normal, sunny but cold. The snowdrops have left us overnight it seems but oh those glorious daffodils all looking the same but different in their shapes and colours. Ten out of ten for them. Thanks to whoever planted them on our verges and in our gardens.

I also think the blossom on the hawthorn, not to mention the shrubs and trees in our gardens, have done us proud. Fingers crossed, my Victoria plum tree will have fruit this year as I so missed my favourite jam last year due to Jack Frost making a late appearance!

Three years ago I bought a twig of an Amelanchier and this year it is a picture standing 6 foot tall and covered in white blossom with emerging red leaves. One to look out for as it is a good all rounder for this area .Mine is on a bank overlooking the patio so I can see the blue sky though it.

My seedlings are all doing well apart from my tomato plants which the little black sciarid fly had thought was a good place to burrow and lay eggs in the compost. When I had a look, all that was left were stubby bits where roots should have been. I washed the roots that were there very gently and repotted them so fingers crossed. I have also started a new packet of another variety of tomatoes so will see how they go. A bit late but hopefully they will catch up.

The bedding plants are doing very well in the HUB polytunnel thanks to Mary and John so we should have plenty for the planters and tubs and some for sale too. We also have perennial plants of Sidalcea and Delphiniums plus Lupins and to support Ukraine we are growing sunflowers for the kids. Happy gardening everyone.
