JESUS - The Light of the World

June is the month of light – the month of the summer solstice, when millions of people in northernmost Europe stay out late to enjoy the sight of the midnight sun. To have light and glory where there is usually darkness is something we celebrate, we welcome.

In John 9 Jesus said: "I am the light of the world." He wasn't comparing Himself to the summer solstice, but preaching at a Jewish occasion which celebrated light every bit as much. It was the Feast of Tabernacles (John 7:14), which was a celebration not only of God's provision of water, but also of the light of God's presence with the Israelites in the wilderness.

During the Feast of Tabernacles there was a joyful celebration. The priests would light four huge lamps in the Court of Women. The flames would reach as high as the temple walls and would provide a light that could be seen all throughout Jerusalem. Men of deep piety would dance throughout the night for the entire week of celebrating. A choir, accompanied by an orchestra of instruments, would sing psalms like Psalm 27, which declare "The Lord is my light and my salvation."

At the height of this grand celebration, the Jesus had the temerity to stand and say that HE was the light that was foreshadowed by the light for the Israelites in the wilderness.

The Jewish leaders were furious, and tried to stone Him to death. Jesus did not fight back, He simply illustrated His claim to be the Light of the World by immediately giving sight to a man born blind. (John 9).

In the 20 centuries since then, the Word of God, when it is proclaimed, has drawn people out of the darkness and into the light of Jesus. The Word is, as the psalmist said, "a lamp to my feet and a light for my path" (Psalm 119:105). David said, "In your light we see light" (Psalm 36:9b). Today, by the light of the Word of God, we can see Jesus as He is: truly the Light of the World.

This is the supplied recipe for Class 5 of the industrial section.

Vegan Courgette Cake Recipe

Ingredients

80g vegan butter block, softened, plus extra for the tin

175g golden caster sugar

2 lemons, zested, 1 juiced

100ml plant milk (we used oat)

100g ground almonds

175g self-raising flour

½ tsp baking powder

175g courgettes, coarsely grated

For the icing 200g icing sugar

Method

STEP 1

Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Butter and line 2 x 450g loaf tins. Beat together the vegan butter block, sugar and lemon zest until combined. Add the plant milk and beat slowly to combine. Add the ground almonds, flour and baking powder, along with the grated courgette, and stir to combine. Spoon the batter into the prepared tin (it will be quite thick) and level the top. Bake each cake for 40-45 mins until a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. Transfer to a wire rack and leave to cool completely in the tin.

STEP 2

To make the icing, sieve the icing sugar into a bowl and add 1 tbsp of the lemon juice and stir to combine. Add a little more lemon juice if needed, ½ tsp at a time, until you reach your desired consistency. Remove the cake from the tin and drizzle over the icing, allowing it to drip down the sides. Leave to set for 20-30 mins. Cut into slices to serve.

Peebles Agricultural Show.

Blankets will be donated to charity.

Knitted Blanket -Basket Weave

With 4mm needles (UK size 8) cast on 140 sts.

Rows 1 -10 Knit

Rows 11-20 knit 10 *Knit 10, purl 10* repeat * to* until last 10 sts, knit 10

Rows 21 – 30 knit 10 *purl 10, knitl 10* repeat * to* until last 10 sts, knit 10

Continue with this pattern until blanket measures approx 24"

Knit final 10 rows, cast off.

Garden Ramblings

Well, here we are at the end of May already and looking out the window there is one shrub taking centre stage and that is a white broom as it is smothered in flowers and is stunning with the sun shining through it. The native rowan behind it will also look good in a few days as the flowers are about to open. Every garden should have a rowan as according to folklore they bring good luck if you have one in your garden.

Rhoddies are looking good in all the gardens big or small. There are a few beauties in the community garden at Lamancha which is open to all.

My one peony has its usual 8 buds and will be flowering in June at the Whipman as per usual. This plant is all of 46 years old as it was gifted when we moved in all those years ago.

I thought I'd lost my Hydrangea which is in a pot but I now see tiny shoots appearing so maybe it's best to wait a bit, say, until June before you give up!

Red and blackcurrants plus gooseberries have benefitted from my free range wee family of hens as they are full of tiny berries. My plum trees have taken a bashing with the wind this winter so will be interesting this autumn to see if there is much fruit. The apples are in blossom and don't do too badly, but as we are at 950 feet above sea level, they don't do as well as the trees that are lower down.

My raised bed is full of leeks and courgettes this year and they seem to be doing all right.
