## 'A death bed life.'

I want to begin with some questions around a question. As you read my questions don't try to answer them just notice what they do to you. Try to pay attention to the feelings, thoughts and memories that they bring up. Are you ready?

If you were on your deathbed, if you were dying and you knew you were dying, what would be your final prayer?

Would you ask God to spare you, perhaps try to bargain with him? Would you express your gratitude and thanks for the life you got to live, for lessons learned and the blessings received? Would you focus on the past or would you look to the future? Would your prayer be for yourself or for others? Would your last words be a recounting of your successes, accomplishments, regrets, disappointments? Would you speak about the things you did and or perhaps left undone? Would you ask for forgiveness? Would you offer forgiveness? Would your prayer be for your loved ones? What would be your best hopes and desires for them?

I'm not trying to be morbid. I'm thinking about Jesus' 'deathbed' prayer in John's gospel (chapter 17). It's the night of the last supper. Jesus is about to die, and he knows it. What strikes me about Jesus' prayer is that he doesn't review his life. He doesn't evaluate what he did, how well he did it, or what he didn't get done. He doesn't negotiate his ending with God. He doesn't even list his thanksgivings. He doesn't give any final instructions or advice to his disciples. Instead, Jesus prays for them and us. He prays for theirs and our future. He bears his heart and expresses his deepest longing and desire; that we "may become completely one." Honestly, at this time in our history I cannot think of a more timely and relevant prayer for us, for our country, and our world today than Jesus' prayer for oneness.

Jesus' '*deathbed prayer*' wasn't something new that came to him at the end of his life. His prayer expressed how he had lived his whole life. It was at the heart of everything he did and taught. In a way Jesus '*deathbed prayer*' reflected the fact that he lived a deathbed life. Now there's a thought to mull over.
