The healing in post-resurrection pain

'Why do we sometimes act as if God is made of porcelain?'

We profess faith in an almighty God, yet we often act as though we secretly fear for His ego. 'Will it shatter if our spiritual lives get too complicated?' 'Will we break God if we honestly confess to an ongoing sense of rage, or a free-floating doubt, or a nagging sense of despair?'

The human cost of tiptoeing around God is staggering. I've watched so many people I love do this. Who don't dare for just a moment to name an honest feeling to God about God. Feelings like "I'm so furious at you God right now," or "God, my faith is doing nothing for me in the midst of this pain." Who is this god we are trying to protect? Is he really so dependent on our shiny pretence?

What helps me here is Jesus. The tears he shed for Lazarus. The anger he expresses in the temple. The fear-filled sense of despair he expresses in Gethsemane. But most of all the wounds he carries with him out of the grave. Jesus' resurrected body doesn't carry faded scars. These are fresh wounds, raw enough to allow a doubting disciple to put his fingers into them.

I find it easy to imagine Jesus wincing when Thomas touched him. I imagine it was a pain that to Thomas signalled real presence. A pain that spoke to what Thomas truly longed for: 'I am here. I don't float in an artificial, antiseptic reality; I dwell in the heart of things. Exactly where you live'.

All around us, people are packaging and pummelling themselves into all forms of piety. A piety they can't sustain because it is not real. Not real like Jesus' honest expressions of grief, anger, and fear.

At the apex of his resurrection, Jesus won a doubter over with His open wounds. More often that we realise our Christian faith holds its greatest appeal when it demonstrates courage and steadfastness in the face of those pains that scare us and hurt us and ravage us. Our wounds don't tell the whole story. But like those of Jesus the stories they do tell are holy and worth sharing.
