“What’s wrong with those people?”

Sometimes when dealing with irritating cold callers on the phone, I will exclaim, *“What’s wrong with these people?”* Actually, I do this more often than I like to admit and not just on the other end of the phone. Sometimes I do it when listening to this or that reporter, or other car drivers, and certain politicians. My wife recently admonished me: *“Tony, nobody is one of ‘those people.’ Be careful because you are slipping into the realm of the collective slur and that’s morally sloppy and morally corrupting. You don’t really know that person’s name, but you do know that they are a person.”*

She’s right of course. I do sometimes allow my momentary annoyance to slide into a wide pool of irritation that pushes other people into *“kinds.”* Individual persons very quickly become *“Those people”*, who work for insurance companies, or *“Those people”* who work for the airlines, or university administrators, or ecclesial bureaucrats, and so on and so on. If I am not careful my world can quickly become populated with a whole series of anonymous, irritating *‘They.’*

I am of course exaggerating a little, but you get my point. My wife was right when she also pointed out that *“‘Those people’ are God’s; and God is the God of each and every one of them”*. Yes, there are ‘kinds,’ ‘types,’ and categories that have a collective character—a *“they”* if you will. But each *‘they’* is made up of persons, who were created as singular individuals. The Bible tells us God knows each one of us by name. Names are important in the Bible and for good reason. Calling a person by their name is a profoundly affirming way of acknowledging the humanity of that person. Acknowledging a person by their name is a way of reminding ourselves that the person we are engaging with is known to God and made in the image of God.

In case you ever find yourself irritated and tempted to resort to the impersonal *‘They,’* let me leave with my wife’s admonishment; *“Nobody is one of ‘those people.’”* We should all be careful of slipping into the habit of using the collective slur because it’s morally sloppy and morally corrupting. You might not know that person’s name, but you do know that they are a person.

Broughtonknowe - 'Woodland For Sale'

For those who do not know Broughtonknowe

it is 135 acres of woodland situated on the A701

about a mile North of Broughton Village. It is more

than just a woodland. It was planted on farmland in the late 1980's by Major David Balfour-Scott whose vision was a commercial planting of conifers softened by large patches of native hardwoods. In addition, there are now three large ponds, with a hide. A considerable area remains as upland grassy heath and marshy meadow. So, in effect there are a range of distinct habitats.

Woodland management has been by selectively felling spruce, larch and other conifers rather than any clear-felling. This has created a semi-natural spacing between the remaining trees producing a very pleasing aesthetic as well as letting in light so encouraging regeneration of more natural plant and animal communities.

The 'Friends of Broughtonknowe' (FoB) was established as a community group in 2020 with the dual aims of 'improving amenity and increasing biodiversity' within the woodland. A wind-farm grant was successfully applied for in 2021 and considerable, volunteer led, work has subsequently enlarged the car park, extended the path network, put in benches, dug two more ponds and created a new picnic facility.

The wildlife highlights are an amazing congregation of frogs and toads at the ponds in the spring. An abundance of butterflies in the grassland areas in the summer and a wonderful diversity of woodland fungi in the autumn. In the winter you can enjoy spectacular panoramas of the surrounding Southern Uplands.

At the top of the woodland there is a picnic and fire-pit area used regularly by the local cubs / scouts and by the Biggar Kirk youth group. The woodland also features a small disused quarry from which 'Green Ash Chairs' runs



short courses using traditional country-craft techniques to make a chair, starting with just a length of young Ash tree. The courses are run by Peter Young. In the summer he erects a large yurt from which FoB have been running a programme of events with a focus on the surrounding natural history, the latest being a 'woodland foraging' event run by Ilka Roehe. It is a wonderfully peaceful setting for mindfulness and general wellbeing as well as for educational experiences.

With the woodland coming on the market this has been a concerning time for all of us who enjoy walking here. A public meeting in the Broughton Village Hall was really well attended and prospects for the future were aired. The consensus was that a bid for a 'Community Buyout' was feasible. Christopher Lambton, the present woodland owner, has stated that he would be very happy to facilitate this. What remains therefore is for us to organise and formulate a management plan that can be submitted to the Scottish Land Fund (SLF). A lot has been going on behind the scenes to meet their criteria and if we are successful up to 90% of the purchase price could be awarded. We would hope to fundraise the remainder of the purchase price. There is already a strong community following on Facebook - 'Friends of Broughtonknowe'. Developments can be followed here, and on our website: broughtonknowe-wood.co.uk

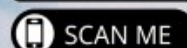

Garden Ramblings

"Summer, what summer?" we gardeners and friends are asking. Sunshine has been in short supply this year. One thing I have noticed is that all plants and shrubs have been phenomenal in their growth. This can only be due to our rain as I haven't fed anything. The roses such as the Jacobite rose (Rosa Alba), Bonica, Rosa Mundi, and last but not least, New Dawn the shell pink climbing rose that has lived up to its reputation of being one of the best roses for shrugging off wet weather. My butterfly bush is almost as tall as the conifer next to it. The Potentillas in their shades of lemon, pink, and white have been amazing.

The few annuals in pots have done well and will soon be replaced with spring bulbs.

In the polytunnel at the community garden I have a few green tomatoes but boy are they slow to ripen. However, they are ripening now due to banana peelings draped over the stems. I'm told this really does help to ripen them so fingers crossed!

Make sure you get out in the sunshine this month.
