Having faith in Faith

To live by faith is not the same as living in certainty. It is logically impossible to be certain about faith. In that sense having faith in God is different to being certain about God. Faith gives us access to the holy and transcendent in ways certainty cannot. Easter is a prime example. It marks the time of year when the Church celebrates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, a feast day that simultaneously calls forth an act of faith and at the same time affirms that act of faith. For centuries Christians have confessed the Apostle's Creed, which begins with the words, "I believe..." not with, "I am certain . . .". Christians have never been certain. There is too much is at stake for that.

Most of the 18th-century philosophers who led the Enlightenment weren't particularly interested in getting rid of religion. They just wanted us to call it faith.

It was an unintentional gift to the Church, because it sought to keep the categories of certainty and faith separate. Our desire for certainty is very understandable especially today when it feels like politically, socially and economically the ground is shifting beneath our feet. We're desperately looking to be certain about something.

And our relationship with God is no different. But the easiest way to destroy someone's love for us is to continually ask them to prove it. All healthy relationships are bound together by faith. All weddings are an act of faith. Our marriages and our friendships are all based on the belief that when a crisis happens we all hope and believe that family and friends will rush to the emergency room.

It wasn't necessary or certain that God would love us despite our sins or indeed forgive us. The decision to give those blessings was God's choice. As for faith, that's just our way of accessing those blessings.

Thankfully, for reasons only He knows, God keep choosing to have faith in our faith. Happy Easter to you and yours.

Report of the Annual Stated Meeting held on 23 March 2025

The Annual Stated Meeting was held in Church after the Communion service on 23 March 2025.

Kevin Scott (Joint Session Clerk) opened the meeting welcoming everyone.

Michael Knott presented the 2024 accounts, which are the subject of a separate report in this newsletter, and thanked Mrs Jean Machael for acting as independent examiner

Steven Whalley (Property Convener) gave a property report. He reported there was less work undertaken this year compared to last year, with the main task being work on the timbers in the east shed roof of the New Church Hall. He stated the work on painting and plastering inside the Church is still outstanding. There was some damage following a recent storm for which insurance claims are being made. He stated a summer maintenance programme (mostly painting) will be undertaken and asked for volunteers. He thanked the Property Committee for their work.

Tony Hoskins reported on the music. He described how the music in Church so enhanced worship, adding so much to words. He thanked the organists, highlighted their individual skills, those who play other instruments in services (like at advent), the choir, worship leaders (for hymn selection) and those on the video desk who project the words of the hymns allowing us to keep our heads up as we sing!

Kevin then summarised the activity of the church, thanking all those involved, including

- Sunday Club which have been looking at Moses and God's laws
- Boys Brigade having had a great year including activity for Peebles Food Bank and the Remembrance Service
- Music providing organ, instruments and voice

 Church Community groups such as Baby Brunch (which has been going for over 10 years and supported 39 families this year and took a role in the nativity service, There was a special mention for Doreen Calvert, no longer with us but who had been involved from early days of Baby Brunch), Guid Blethers and Community Cafe.

He read out a statement from Early Learners/After School Club, who on a busy day can have 14 children in a day. They employ eight staff. They expressed thanks to the Church as a considerate and responsive landlord.

Kevin then thanked a long list of people, all vital to the operation of the Church.

Our Minister, Tony Foley closed the meeting, reflecting on all we do, acknowledging its tremendous scope, that we should be encouraged, and that we are noticed and appreciated.

Grounds Maintenance

Early Learners (committee and parent helpers) recently carried out some work to tidy up the outside space at the New Hall, including renewal of the bark chippings. This is greatly appreciated and our thanks go to all those involved.

Finance Report for 2024

The congregational accounts for 2024 were presented at the Stated Annual Meeting. Copies are available in the Church or can be requested from any elder.

Income from offerings and Gift Aided contributions was up by around 4% on 2023 levels, with hall rental income being up by around 10% following a decision to apply an increased level of hire charges. A successful grant application was made to the Kenny Paul Trust for support with the cost of improvements made to the New Church Hall primarily for the benefit of Early Learners as the main hall users.

We did see a notable increase in expenditure though, including settlement of Clelands' £14,000 invoice for repairs that were carried out to the roof and external walls of the Church building during 2023/24. Increases were also noted in St Andrew's contribution to the cost of ministry under the Church of Scotland's 'Giving to Grow' scheme, and in the level of electricity charges incurred in both the Church and the halls.

There was an overall shortfall for 2024 of around £8,000 which serves to further reduce the Church's reserves. It was noted that a reduced shortfall of around £5,000 (similar to the result for 2023) would instead have applied if delayed receipts from VAT and Gift Aid tax recovery totalling around £3,000 had been received in December rather than in January 2025.

While it is fortunate that the higher costs referred to above did not result in a much higher shortfall, it is noted that the continued 'chipping away' of reserves cannot be sustained in the longer term. It will therefore remain important that costs continue to be carefully

managed and that income is maintained, or increased where possible. Gift Aid provides a valuable boost to the Church's income and taxpayers who have not already done so are encouraged to consider completing a Gift Aid declaration in conjunction with giving by Standing Order or FreeWill Offering envelopes – I will be happy to provide more details on request – contact details on page 11.

Lastly, on behalf of the Kirk Session, I would like to record our thanks to Mrs Jean Macnab for her diligent work as Independent Examiner in reviewing the Church's accounts once again this year.
