'Whatabouterism'

In 2013, the then future Prime Minister of the UK, Boris Johnson wrote an article, describing what he called "dead cat" strategy politics. Or what I have termed 'whatabouterism'. Imagine for a moment a family heatedly engaged in some hoary familial argument. When, in walks granddad and slams a mangy and very dead cat on the table. In that moment, the argument is forgotten. The dead cat is all the family is talking about. Johnson's somewhat cynical point was that if you present the public with an outrageous, ridiculous, and scandalous piece of news, they completely forget about the much more pertinent issue that needs their attention. It is a tactic political media strategists and spin doctors seek to use almost every day — it's when they shout "Oh, look over there!" - 'What about that!' This insipient form of 'Whatabouterism' is the plague of our time. It is the stuff that Social Media and our 24/7 news media thrives on.

In 1990, the Nobel Prize winner and Pulitzer Prize Saul Bellow gave a lecture at Oxford University titled "*The Distracted Public*." In his talk, Bellow lamented what he called the looming "moronic inferno" that was being fuelled by our contemporary addiction to distraction, which if left unchecked would one day become, "the apocalypse of our times." He called on artists and writers everywhere to raise their voices and use their talents to counter this

"massive and worldwide hostile condition" that is besetting humanity.

C.S. Lewis struck a similar note in a sermon he preached during the Second World War speaking to what he called the 'The task of our times,' counselled his listeners: "Never, in peace or war, commit your virtue or your happiness to the future. Happy work is best done by the person who takes their long-term plans somewhat lightly... The present is the only time in which any duty can be done, or any grace received."

The 'Whatabouterism,' of popular media that is constantly trying to invade our daily lives is emotionally akin to finding ourselves out at sea caught in the thrall of never ending squalls. Perhaps that is what Jesus was trying to warn us about when he counselled us to: 'Give your entire attention to what God is doing right now, and don't get worked up about what may or may not happen tomorrow. God will help you deal with whatever hard things come up when the time comes.' MATTHEW 6:34



Unity - Acts 4:32-35

This short passage from Acts is all about unity, about being united in God's purpose, about being together, and the blessing and power there is in that unity.

What does unity say to me and about my life, and in particular my life as a follower of Christ? For me there's a hierarchy where unity is fundamental. This hierarchy starts, foundationally, with my relationship with Jesus. Am I united with Christ? Am I as united with Christ as I could be or as I should be? Or am I just comfortable with the idea that Jesus walks with me each step of each day. Walking in that knowledge and confidence is a wonderful thing but how much more is there if I'm united with Christ?

And then there's wider unity in relationships, are we united with husband, with wife. As individuals we are selfish, we look to ourselves, to the things that we feel we need to do individually, but as husband and wife we need to look to each other first, and then look to the other things we feel are important. Then there is unity with family, which is not always easy, unity with friends, unity with work colleagues. Some of these aren't easy at all, but where there's unity there is strength, there is power and there is blessing.

And how are we doing as Church? As Church are we united in Christ? Do we carry that unity with us in power within our own Church community, across our Linkage and out to the wider local community around us?

In this passage from Acts the believers were completely united (Acts 4:32a). All the believers were of one heart and mind. Being of "One heart and mind" is a comprehensive unity. There was both a spiritual unity and a unity of commitment to the shared purpose of the believers. There was only one agenda and it was God's agenda. There weren't different subgroups of the believers off pursuing their own agendas. They were completely united.

The believers shared generously with one another (Acts 4:32b). There was a voluntary desire to meet the needs of others. The believers weren't forced or coerced to give anything. People wanted to give because they didn't want anyone to be without.

The apostles stayed focussed on their mission (Acts 4:33). They continued (Continued on page 10)

to share the message of the gospel proclaiming the resurrection of Jesus Christ. This was the thing that society around them commanded them not to do, but they did it anyway. They were united with Christ! The apostles could not be diverted because they were all united and together they were all united in Christ. Their path was not without risk but they walked in a power that they could not turn from.

So where are we now? Where is our unity? Where is our focus as individual followers of Christ, as congregations of followers of Christ, as Church? If the church as a whole is as divided as the world why would anyone believe that Jesus came from God to save the world?

I come back to where I started. Am I as united with Christ as I could and should be? Is Jesus at the centre of my life? Because that should be my true foundation, my one foundation. That is the foundation from which unity with my personal community will flow, unity with my wife, unity with family and friends, unity within my Church community, unity at work and within my wider community. It is only from this foundation of unity in and with Christ that the fullness of God's grace, power and blessing will flow from me and from us.

Christian unity is a unity of heart and soul, a unity which leads people to work together in harmony, seeking God's will and not their own. This unity is encapsulated in Jesus' prayer for all his disciples, past and present, from John 17:20-23.

"I am praying not only for these disciples but also for all who will ever believe in me through their message. I pray that they will all be one, just as you and I are one, as you are in me Father and I am in you.

And may they be in us so that the world will believe you sent me.

"I have given them the glory you gave me so they may be one as we are one.

I am in them and you are in me.

May they experience such perfect unity that the world will know that you sent me and that you love them as much as you love me."
