'The peace of grace and the grace of shalom'

'Grace is unmoved. It is the light that melts the spring, where words and world fill up with meaning.' – Jan Zwicky

Words matter, they carry the freight of our meanings. Like sign posts they point to a shared reality. Like tunnels, they help us get into and out of concepts. What we mean by our words matters. The casual acceptance of phrases like *'alternative facts' 'post-truth'* and *'my truth'* comes with political, social, and personal costs. In a social landscape where signposts are allowed to mean different things to different individuals it is very easy to get lost. There is no culture without a common standard of meaning, a shared understanding that offers a sense of connection to and regard for others. In a world marked by discord, division and the violence that often follows, the safety of our common future rests on attending to what we mean by our words.

In a world longing for peace and a Church praying for peace what do we mean, by the word "peace"? Do we mean an absence of strife? Do we mean the act of intentionally forgetting in order to forge a compromised future or do we mean a forgiveness that begins with assigning blame but ends with showing mercy and giving grace? (Continued on page 2) It often seems that what most people mean by "peace" is the victory of their side while for others 'peace' means a consequence of their defeat. In the fractious world of national politics peace increasingly feels like a place we don't know how to fully inhabit anymore.

In the Bible, the word *Shalom* is used to refer to peace. It defines a situation of mutual flourishing, where the well-being, prosperity, and security of all is a given. Ultimately, the *Shalom* God offers us is characterised not by justice for all, but by grace toward all.

Offering you opportunities to be a good neighbour

Could you spare a few hours occasionally to take a neighbour to a medical appointment? Linton Lifts gives you the chance to make new friends in your own area by offering a door-to-door service to wherever the appointment is, since in some cases it takes three buses to get there and three buses back. Patients are often in an anxious state, and perhaps are quite elderly and/or no longer driving – a friendly face can make all the difference.

Drivers are reimbursed by the statutory mileage allowance and clients are simply asked to make a donation to Linton Lifts to cover this. Clients must be able to access a car without assistance (we cannot take wheelchair users, sorry) but we do take along carers when required.

We are in the foothills of running this service and in order to feel able to advertise it more widely **we need more drivers** to make themselves available so that no-one is asked to drive too frequently. When a request is made Margaret puts out a call to see who is available on the relevant day, so no need to have a day set aside on a regular basis – it's more whenever you happen to be free to help.
